#### **School Hours**

French students attend school four to five days a week, with classes generally starting at 8:30 AM and ending around 4:30 PM, depending on the grade level.



#### School Week

Most schools follow a four-day week, with Wednesdays off or half-days, although some schools now offer classes on Wednesday mornings.



#### Holidays

The school year is punctuated by several vacation breaks: two weeks each in October (Toussaint), December, February, and April, plus a summer break of about two months.














## OUR STRENGTHS



- Specialized staff training: teachers received training on epilepsy management, so they <u>can respond effectively during seizures</u>,
- Personalized learning strategies: adaptations of the lessons matching student's specific needs and learning paces,
- Multidisciplinary work: for a student, there are medical, educational, and school professionals

## OUR STRENGTHS



Small classes: we have small classes of 8-10 students. In an ordinary environment, there are between 25 and 35 depending on the course.
Professional aptitude certificate in 3 years: In ordinary high schools, it's two years. There are 22 hours of lessons vs 30 hours per week.

**Project pedagogy:** to give meaning to learning
